

COMMUNITY COUNCIL MINUTES

Agenda items

The meeting was called to order by Jamie Hunter at 3:30 p.m.

1. Review of last year's academic data and School Plan. There was a drop in RISE scores. In response to this trend, the following steps were taken:
 - a. Certified teachers were hired for interventions across all grades. One part-time teacher for grades 4-6, and two teachers to share a part-time position for grades 1-3.
 - b. A 95% (Phonics program) Blitz was organized to instruct all students in grades 1-3 during the same period each day. Students are reassessed on a regular basis and placed in small groups that align with their phonics//reading needs.
2. Final Report and Budget was reviewed from last year. This was filed and reported to State by the 10/18/19 deadline.
3. The 2019-2020 Student Success Plan was reviewed and discussed. Three major goals were identified and outlined in plan.
 - a. Reading - Increase in RISE and Dibels performance.
 - b. Math - Increase in RISE performance.
 - c. Behavior - Reduce the number of incident referrals through the use of restorative circles and conferencing.
 - i. The concept of a "Check-In/Check-Out" person was introduced. This individual would work with students with Tier 2 behaviors that need some extra tracking, support and accountability.
 - ii. Jamie Hunter moved to establish this position as part of our behavior structure.
 - iii. Missy Rose seconded the motion.
 - iv. Vote to pass was unanimous.
4. Budget to date was reviewed to assess if any amendments were needed.
 - a. In lieu of proposed addition of "Check-in/Check-out" staff member, a wage of \$4,000 per year would need to be added to budget.
 - b. Money would be reallocated from software and supplies budgets.
 - c. Jamie Hunter moved to add amendment to budget to cover this cost.
 - d. Motion was seconded by Haley Binggeli.
 - e. Vote to pass was unanimous.

5. There are safety issues occurring in the Student Drop-Off/Pick-up zone. Parents and children are weaving through cars to walk across the street to the east of the school. Several actions were discussed.
 - a. Jamie Hunter will make a flyer that will go home with students to draw attention to issue.
 - b. Information will be sent out through Parent Square regarding concerns (Jill)
 - c. Jamie Hunter will contact local officers to see if they can enforce Jay Walking.
 - d. Teachers will be asked to discuss this issue with their students.
 - e. Other possible actions to consider include - Signs on fence or cones, High-five paws tickets given to students who use the crosswalk.
